It is our honor to introduce the California Arts Council Administrators of Color Fellowship (CAC ACF), in partnership with California Arts Council, SVCreates, and with support from The James Irvine Foundation. The goal of CAC ACF is to uplift an inclusive workforce and support the vibrancy of organizations that create and preserve the cultural identities of all California communities.

10 Fellows and 10 Host Organizations will be selected for a statewide pilot program that will begin in October 2020 for a nine-to 12-month period.

WHY APPLY

Fellows will receive a \$50K stipend, plus:

- (1) An increased skillset, capacity, and knowledge to become an effective arts administrator
- (2) Experience representing an arts and/or culture organization dedicated to equity and community engagement
- (3) Recognition for advancing organizational structures, policies and practices with inclusive decision-making.

Host Organization will receive a \$35K grant, plus:

- (1) The tools, capacity, and knowledge to become an effective arts and/cultural organization in the creative sector
- (2) Experience hosting a Fellow and piloting a program dedicated to equity and community engagement
- (3) Enhanced organization structures, policies, and practices which emphasize inclusive decision-making.
